

NOTICE No 24/ANAC/2022

PUBLIC CALL FOR ARTICLES TO BE PUBLISHED IN A COMPENDIUM CELEBRATING TEN YEARS OF THE INTERNALIZATION OF THE CAPE TOWN CONVENTION AND ITS AERONAUTIC PROTOCOL

The AIRWORTHINESS SUPERINTENDENT, in the use of the attributions conferred upon him by art. 31, XVIII and art. 35, item XIII, of the Internal Regulations approved by Resolution No. 381, of June 14, 2016, and considering the content of process No. 00058.051910/2022-17, makes public the call for the preparation and submission of articles to be published in a compendium commemorating the ten years of the internalization of the Cape Town Convention and its Aeronautical Protocol.

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1 This public call aims at the elaboration of a collective work of authors with expertise and knowledge about the Cape Town Convention and its Aeronautical Protocol, in order to contribute to the analysis of the advances, main problems and challenges involving the application of the law and, especially, the practical repercussion in the civil aviation sector in Brazil.

1.2 This is an initiative to stimulate the production of scientific articles about the Cape Town Convention, considering the (10) ten-year-anniversary of the internalization of the treaty by Brazil and its relevance to the national and international aviation market. This initiative seeks to make the Convention known to a wide range of interested parties, to disseminate knowledge on the subject and to promote a debate on the consequences of accession to the Convention on Brazilian aviation.

1.3 The work will bring together legal articles that deal with the Cape Town Convention and its aeronautical protocol, especially on:

I - the ten years of internalization of the Cape Town Convention by Brazil and its impact on the national aviation scenario;

II - operational aspects of the Cape Town Convention and its Aircraft Protocol and the declarations made by Brazil; and

III - subjects that promote debate on best practices, challenges and consequences of accession, in order to stimulate training and updating of civil servants, judges, members of the Public Prosecution Service, lawyers and others interested in this specialized branch of law.

1.4. The publication will be in the format of an e-book, which will be published in the thematic site of the Cape Town Convention and its aeronautical protocol and in other similar

electronic channels. Please note that ANAC reserves the right to produce a printed version of part or all of the compendium to be used as a complementary means of dissemination.

1.5. The authors will not be remunerated or awarded for the publication of their work by ANAC, in any type of printed media (paper) or electronic (Internet, e-book, etc.).

1.6. The works to be published may be used, in whole or in part, for educational and non-commercial applications, provided the source is indicated.

1.7 The concepts and opinions contained in the accepted articles are the sole responsibility of their authors, and in no way reflect ANAC's opinion on the matter. This work is intended to foster legal debate on the Convention by the various sectors involved.

2. PAPER SUBMISSION

2.1 The submissions, regarding the format and content of the article, should follow the following rules:

I - the articles should maintain thematic relation with the theme "Ten years of internalization of the Cape Town Convention by Brazil" and related subjects, as described in item 1.3 of this notice. Articles without thematic pertinence will be rejected;

II - the articles must be submitted to the electronic address registro.internacional@anac.gov.br, until January 15, 2023;

III - papers may be of individual or collective authorship, and must be unpublished in Brazil;

IV - the authors must sign electronically (with an ICP-Brasil certificate or through the GOV.BR platform) the copyright assignment term presented in Annex I of this notice - Assignment of Copyright Agreement and send it in .pdf format. When in co-authorship, each author must sign and forward his own term of assignment;

V - the concepts and opinions contained in the articles are the sole responsibility of their authors, as well as any possible conflict of interest, exempting ANAC from any responsibility for the content of these works;

VI - By participating in the public call for papers, the author is aware that the selection and publication of his article does not reflect in any way ANAC's position on the matter;

VII - by participating in the public call, the author is aware that he/she will not be remunerated or awarded for the publication of his/her work by ANAC, in any type of printed media (paper) or electronic (internet, e-book, etc.).

VIII - the papers should be preceded by a title page that should include: (i) title, abstract (as per rules provided in clause XII of this article) and keywords (as per rules provided in clause XIII of this article) in Portuguese or English; (ii) name(s) of each author, resumé of

up to 3 lines with institutional affiliation, main academic titles and/or main activity exercised, and contact e-mail;

IX - the paper must be sent in two copies, one as .pdf and the other as .docx, in editable form;

X - the articles should have between 5 and 15 pages, written in Portuguese or English, using the font "Times New Roman", size 12. The paper size should be A4 and the top and bottom margins should measure 2 cm, and the side margins, 3 cm;

XI - paragraphs should be justified and have 1.5 line spacing. No indentations, displacements, or spacing should be used before or after.

XII - the abstract will follow the guidelines of ABNT NBR 6028:2003 (Brazilian Norm of the Brazilian Association of Technical Norms), and should contemplate, in its structure, four parts: (i) object (what it is about); (ii) objective (what it intends to achieve); (iii) method (type of research or textual structure); and (iv) conclusion (results achieved). It will have, at most, eight lines, and will be written in one paragraph, obeying the grammatical punctuation marks;

XIII - the key words (words or expressions that express the central ideas of the text) should be a maximum of five, as in the example: "Key words: Cape Town. Case Study. UNIDROIT. Jurisprudence. Challenge.";

XIV - regarding structure: (i) the introduction should contain the justification and objectives of the paper, highlighting the relevance of the theme under investigation; (ii) the development should include the discussion and/or analysis of the hypotheses presented, with adequate bibliographical support; (iii) the conclusion should contain a concise response to the proposed objectives; (iv) the numbering of the topics should be progressive, identified with Arabic numerals, without a period, with two spaces before the title of the topic (Example: 2); the subsections have a period in between (Example: 2. 1).

XV - References should be made in accordance with ABNT NBR 6023:2002, and should be cited in the author-date system, according to item 6.3 of ABNT NBR 10520:2002, in the body of the main text. All sources used in the research and cited in the text should appear at the end of the article under the heading "References";

XVI - quotations from other authors that contain up to three lines should be made between quotation marks, in the body of the text, without the use of italics. Quotations that exceed three lines should appear in a separate paragraph, with 4 cm indentation, with the font size one point smaller than the main text, without quotation marks, according to the guidelines of ABNT NBR 10520:2002 (Quotations in documents);

XVII - the legislative or jurisprudential references should contain all the necessary data for their adequate identification and location;

XVIII - in citations of websites, the date of access should be expressly indicated in the format of the following example: "Access on Mar 3rd,2022".

XIX - If the article is in Portuguese, citations in foreign languages must be translated into Portuguese, indicating the text in the original language in the footnote;

XX - the footnotes on each page will be used, preferably, for the presentation of concepts and explanations that cannot be inserted into the body of the text;

XXI - any emphasis that is to be given to the text must be done with the use of italics. Bold or underlined should never be used;

XXII - diagrams, charts, tables and figures may be placed in the text, but they should be numbered and their sources should be presented. Their position must be inserted in the body of the text, with reference to them in the body of the article. Repetition of information contained in the text should be avoided;

XXIII - the authors may work with case studies, with the indication of concrete cases, in jurisprudence or institutional practice being necessary;

XXIV - papers that do not meet any of the submission standards will be rejected;

XXV - the approved works that present minimal formal and technical inadequacies will, at the discretion of the Selection Committee and in order to comply with the rules set forth in this Notice, be altered during their review, maintaining the content and meaning of the text; and

XXVI - sending the text indicates that the authors express their agreement and acceptance in relation to the rules of this call for papers and implies their express authorization for publication.

3. THE SELECTION OF ARTICLES

3.1 A Selection Committee will be appointed by the Airworthiness Superintendency - SAR to choose the articles.

3.2 Articles will be chosen considering the technical and scientific quality, reserving to the Selection Committee the right to increase or decrease the number of articles chosen, considering the quantity and quality of the works received. The choice of articles will be based on:

I - adherence to the theme proposed in item 1.2 of this Notice;

II - the relevance and pertinence between the theme of the article, the Cape Town Convention and the Brazilian Aeronautical Industry;

III - the development of the idea proposed in the article, the understanding and mastery of the theme proposed in Article 3, and the contribution to the improvement of the sector; and

IV - the use of standard language.

3.3 Articles will be rejected:

I – if they don't keep thematic pertinence with compendium;

II – if it does not respect the formatting rules proposed in item 2.1 of this notice;

III - without the submission form;

IV – if it is offensive or disrespectful; and

V – if they do not present a minimum technical quality, considering the use of the standard language, development of the proposed ideas and correlation of ideas.

4. FINAL PROVISIONS

4.1. ANAC may decide not to publish the compendium if there are not enough articles, or if the articles submitted are not of satisfactory quality, or if they are not appropriate to the topic.

4.2 The final decision on omitted cases will be made by the Selection Committee.
