Brazilian Concession Regime



- Underground resources belong to the State
- Foreign and domestic companies may explore these resources under concession
- Concessions granted by the State through licensing rounds



Responsibilities



- Licensing of Areas
 Definition of Blocks
 Promotion of Licensing Rounds
 Concession Agreement
 Administration and collection of Government Take
- National Resource Database
- Regulation and fiscalization of E&P activities



Concession Agreement



Model Concession Agreement developed to reflect several considerations
 Requirements of Petroleum Law
 Brazilian legal context and background
 International practice and experience
 Suggestions received during the virtual public hearings

- ANP entered into 397 Concession Agreements with Petrobras in August 1998
- 67 more added from Brazil Rounds 1, 2 and 3



Evolution of the Concession Agreement



- Evolution reflects the experience gained by the ANP as a result of managing the granted concessions
- Reflects also comments and suggestions received



Principal Changes Made



- Better definition of the right to export and in the clauses regarding Breach and Termination
- Insertion of new definitions and legislative references
- Possibility of temporary interruption of production
- Simplification and clarification of procedures
- Possibility of extension of Exploration Periods
- Possibility of drilling wells in substitution for seismic Minimum Exploration Program



Balance of Changes made since Brazil Round 1



- More opportunities in the sector
 Reduced minimum required equity
 Reduced technical experience requirements for less technically challenging areas
- REPETRO, ONIP, and agreements with other educational and research institutions
- Spec Seismic Program
- Foreign currency bank accounts
- Cooperation agreement with IBAMA



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- Contributions and suggestions always welcome
- Base text : Third Round Contract
- Not many changes expected
- Initial model will be available in March 2002
- Final model will be included in the Final Tender Protocol in May 2002

Open Access for Natural Gas Pipelines



- Article 58 of Law Petroleum Law
- Draft Portaria issued in March 2001
 Many comments from industry and others
 National energy crisis underscored urgency of issue
- Portaria 98 in June 2001
 Principles for an "Open Season" process
 Open Season underway with completion expected 10 2002
- Additional comprehensive Portaria required to establish sound legal basis for further development of the gas sector
 To be issued upon completion of the Open Season to lay out rules for capacity allocation, tariff calculations, grandfathering provisions, etc.
