





ANP promotes bid rounds and signs contracts with concessionaires for exploration, development and production activities of the Oil and Gas industry





Brazilian Reserves and Production


From 1997 to 2006, proved oil reserves increased from 7 billion barrels to 12 billion barrels. Gas reserves increased from 228 billion cubic meters to 348 billion cubic meters.





In 2006, the proved oil reserves amounted to 12 billion barrels.

Evolution of proved natural gas reserves, by location (onshore and offshore) - 1997-2006




The proved gas reserves amounted to 348 billion cubic meters in 2006.



Brazilian Reserves and Production

In 2006, Brazil became self-sufficient in oil production: 1.7 million bpd.



In 2006, crude oil production amounted to 651 million boe and natural gas to 112 million boe.

The oil and gas sector is one of the most dynamic in the Brazilian economy, promoting economic development and technological innovation.

From 1997 to 2005, the oil & Gas industry experienced expansion of 350%.



Brazil: A Great Opportunity

- There are 29 sedimentary basins with significant oil and gas potential, covering an acreage of 7 million km².
- 285,104 km² of exploration areas are under concession in 523 blocks, corresponding to 4.4% of the sedimentary basins.
- Campos Basin accounts for 84% of the national oil production.
- Santos Basin's proved gas reserves increased 36% from 2005 to 2006.
- In Espirito Santo Basin, the second largest in oil production, there are expressive prospects of light oil discoveries.



Brazil: A Great Opportunity

- 60 economic groups are working in the Brazilian upstream sector. 30 foreign are from 14 countries.
- Investment forecasts for E&P activities amount to US\$ 30.7 billion from 2006 to 2010.
- The operations covered by concession contracts are supervised by ANP.
- Brazil has a well-established industry of goods and services, working in a competitive market, which provides investors with reliable qualified supply.

Seismic Surveying Improves Brazil's Oil and Gas Discoveries



Brazil is among the countries with the highest level of seismic data acquisition.

From 1999 to 2006, more than 366,000 km of 2D seismic data and more than 245,000 km² of 3D seismic data were acquired.

Nowadays, an expressive amount of new seismic data of high potential areas is available.




Through BDEP's website it is possible to access, with any browser, an application called BDEP Web Maps, which provides interactive maps with positioning and information about:

- Gravimetric and Magnetometric Data










Rules for Submission of Offers






- Since 1999, ANP has performed eight bidding rounds for oil and gas exploration & production, in which 582 exploratory blocks were granted, covering an acreage of 407,000 km².
- Brasil Round 9 will follow the previous rounds model, including areas in mature, new frontier and high potential basins.
- With a differential portfolio, the new Bid will also offer opportunities for small to medium-sized companies to invest in areas onshore.
