

**SCHEDULE OF COMMITMENTS ON MOVEMENT OF NATURAL PERSONS  
PARAGUAY**

The following sets out Paraguay's commitments in accordance with Article 11.4 (Grant of Temporary Entry) in Chapter 11 (Movement of Natural Persons) in respect of the temporary entry and stay of natural persons of a State Party into the territory of another State Party.

Description of Category	Conditions and Limitations (including length of stay)
A. Business Visitors	
<b>Business visitors</b> means natural persons working in a senior position who are responsible for establishing an enterprise. They do not engage in direct transactions with the general public and do not receive remuneration from a source located within Paraguay.	The period of stay for this category is 90 (ninety) days renewable for the same period.
B. Business Sellers	
<b>Business sellers</b> means natural persons who are representatives of a juridical person of a State Party seeking entry and temporary stay into the territory of another State Party for the purpose of negotiating the sale of services or entering into agreements to sell services for that supplier. They do not engage in making direct sales to the general public and do not receive remuneration from a source located within Paraguay, nor are they commission agents.	The period of stay for this category is 1 (one) year up to 2 (two) years.
C. Contractual Services Suppliers	
<b>Contractual Services Suppliers</b> refer to employees of a company established abroad that	The term of stay is up to 1 (one) year renewable for the same period.

temporarily enter the territory in order to provide a service under a contract.	
D. Intra-corporate transferees	
<p><b>Intra-corporate transferees</b> includes managers, executives, senior personnel and specialists as follows:</p> <p>(a) <b>Executives and senior personnel</b> – persons in the organisation who primarily direct the management of the organisation. They exercise wide latitude in decision-making and receive only supervision or direction from high-level executives, the board of directors or stockholders. They do not directly perform tasks related to the provision of the service(s) of the organisation.</p> <p>(b) <b>Managers</b> – persons in an enterprise or organisation who primarily direct a department or subdivision. They supervise and control the work of other supervisory, professionals or managerial staff. They have the authority to hire or dismiss personnel, recommend their hiring or dismissal or take other personnel action such as promotion or leave authorisation. They exercise discretionary authority over day-to-day activities. Does not include first-line supervisors unless those supervised are professionals, nor employees who primarily perform tasks required for the provision of the service.</p>	<p>The period of stay for this category is at least 1 (one) year up to 2 (two) years.</p>

<p>(e) <b>Specialists</b> – persons in an enterprise or organisation who possess knowledge at an advanced level of expertise and who possess proprietary knowledge of the organisation’s services, research equipment, techniques or management.</p>
