

**SCHEDULE OF COMMITMENTS ON MOVEMENT OF NATURAL PERSONS  
URUGUAY**

The following sets out Uruguay's commitments in accordance with Article 11.4 (Grant of Temporary Entry) in Chapter 11 (Movement of Natural Persons) in respect of the temporary entry and stay of natural persons of a State Party into the territory of another State Party.

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| A. Business visitors   |   |
| <b>Business Visitors</b> refer to persons entering Uruguay for temporary stay for business purposes.   | The duration of stay in the country may be up to two years. |
| B. Visits by specialised professional or technical personnel   |   |
| <b>Visits by specialised professional or technical personnel</b> refer to natural persons entering Uruguay for limited periods to provide a service under a contract between them and a client located in the country: scientists, researchers, teaching staff, professionals, academics, technical and specialised personnel engaged in activities in the country related to their specialist work, journalists, sportsmen and women and artists. | The duration of stay in the country may be up to two years. |
| C. Intra-corporate transferees:  |   |
| (a) <b>Managers</b> – Persons within an enterprise or organisation who primarily direct a department or subdivision. They supervise and control the work of other supervisory,   | The duration of stay in the country may be up to two years. |

professional or managerial employees. They have the authority to hire and fire or recommend hiring/firing or other personnel actions (such as promotion or leave authorisation). They exercise discretionary authority over day-to-day operations. This term does not include first-line supervisors, unless the employees supervised are professionals, nor does it include employees who primarily perform tasks necessary for the provision of the service.

- (b) **Executives Directors – Managers** – Persons within an organisation who primarily direct the management of the organisation. They exercise wide latitude in decision-making and receive only general supervision or direction from higher level executives, the board of directors or stockholders. Executives would not directly perform tasks related to the provision of the service or services of the company or organisation of which they primarily direct a department or subdivision.

They supervise and control the work of other supervisory, professional or managerial employees. They have the authority to hire and fire or recommend hiring/firing or other personnel actions (such as promotion or leave authorisation). They exercise discretionary authority over day-to-day operations. This term does not include first-line supervisors, unless the employees supervised are professionals, nor does it include employees
